In general, one should never eat an unknown plant or its parts without first doing some research. By educating yourself and your family you can coexist happily with these beautiful and useful plants.

- Arum italicum Italian Arum (All parts, especially fruit)
- Asclepias Milkweed (Sap)
- Brugmansia Angel's Trumpet (All parts)
- Colchicum Autumn Crocus (Bulbs)
- Convallaria Lily-of-the-Valley (All parts)
- Cytisus scoparius Scotch Broom (All parts?)
- Datura Thorn Apple (All parts)
- Delphinium Larkspur (Young plants, seeds)
- Dicentra Bleeding Heart (All parts)
- Digitalis purpurea Foxglove (All parts)
- Euphorbia Spurge (Sap)
- Hedera helix Common Ivy (Leaves, fruit)
- Helleborus niger Christmas Rose (All parts?)
- Hyacinthus Hyacinth (Bulbs)
- *Ilex aquifolium* European Holly (Fruit)
- Laburnum Golden Chain Tree (All parts)
- *Lilium* Lily (All parts)
- Malus Apple (Seeds)
- Narcissus Daffodil (Bulbs)
- Nerium oleander Oleander (All parts)
- Passiflora caerulea Blue Passion Flower (Leaves)
- Podophyllum peltatum Mayapple
- Prunus spp. Cherry, Peach, Plum, Apricot (Leaves, Seeds)
- Rheum rhaponticum Rhubarb (Leaves)

- Rhododendron Rhododendron, Azalea (All parts, pollen, nectar)
- Ricinus communis Castor Bean (Seeds)
- Robinia Black Locust (Fruit, seed, bark, flower)
- Sambucus Elderberry (Roots)
- Sanguinaria canadensis Bloodroot (Rhizome)
- Solanum spp. Tomatoes (Leaves, stems), Potatoes (Leaves, stems, fruit)
- Taxus baccata English Yew (All parts)
- Wisteria Wisteria (Seeds)
- Zantedeschia Calla Lily (All parts)
